1 Introduction

- 1.1. This <u>REC Schedule</u> sets out the requirements relating to the transfer of certain Consumer data between Parties. The data in question comprises:
 - (a) PSR Data concerning records on the Priority Services Registers; and
 - (b) <u>Consumer Contact Data</u> for contacting <u>Consumers</u>, particularly in the case of emergency situations.

PSR Data

- 1.2 PSR Data is only relevant to Domestic Consumers.
- 1.3 Each <u>Energy Supplier</u> and electricity <u>Distribution Network Operator</u> is required by its <u>Energy Licence</u> to maintain a <u>Priority Services Register</u>. Priority services include



support provided to help particular <u>Consumers</u> engage with their gas or electricity account and/or ensuring priority for <u>Domestic Consumers</u> in the event of network disruption. The <u>Priority Services Register</u> is also used by <u>Energy Suppliers</u> to support effective safeguarding activities.

- 1.4 Each <u>Gas Transporter</u> is required by its <u>Energy Licence</u> to maintain practices and procedures to identify <u>Domestic Consumers</u> who may be eligible for assistance due to their circumstances, and to offer these <u>Consumers</u> specific priority services.
- 1.5 Each <u>Energy Supplier</u> is obliged by its <u>Energy Licence</u> to share <u>PSR Data</u> via the relevant industry mechanism as specified in this Schedule.
- 1.6 Each <u>Distribution Network Operator</u> is required by its <u>Energy Licence</u> to share <u>PSR</u> <u>Data</u> with the <u>Registered Supplier</u> and/or with the relevant <u>Gas Transporter</u>.
- 1.7 Each <u>Gas Transporter</u> is required by its <u>Energy Licence</u> to share <u>PSR Data</u> with the Registered Gas Supplier and/or with the relevant <u>Distribution Network Operator</u>.
- 1.8 An <u>Energy Supplier</u> may also issue <u>PSR Data</u> to its <u>Supplier Agents</u>, as further detailed in the <u>Data Specification</u>.

Consumer Contact Data

- 1.9 <u>Consumer Contact Data</u> is relevant to <u>Domestic Consumers</u> and <u>Non-Domestic Consumers</u>.
- 1.10 However, the obligation to provide <u>Consumer Contact Data</u> for gas is only relevant to <u>Consumers</u> at sites with an <u>Annual Quantity</u> of up to 732,000kWh (25,000 therms). Sites with a larger <u>Annual Quantity</u> are not subject to Paragraph 5, and are instead subject to separate arrangements under the <u>UNC</u>.
- 1.11 <u>Consumer Contact Data</u> may also be used by holders of <u>Energy Licences</u> in order to comply with duties under their <u>Energy Licences</u>, and subject to the further requirements and limitations of this <u>REC Schedule</u>.

2 Conditions Precedent

- 2.1 Each <u>Energy Supplier</u>, <u>Gas Transporter</u> and <u>Distribution Network Operator</u> shall only share <u>PSR Data</u> in accordance with the requirements set out in its <u>Energy Licence</u>. If the requirements of this <u>REC Schedule</u> are inconsistent with such licence requirements, then the licence requirements shall take precedence.
- 2.2 Each <u>Party</u> shall only access, update, share, use or otherwise process <u>PSR Data</u> and <u>Consumer Contact Data</u> insofar as is necessary to comply with its <u>Energy Licence</u> and any other statutory obligations which apply to it as the holder of an <u>Energy Licence</u>.
- 2.3 In addition to the purposes set out in Paragraph 2.2, the <u>Gas Transporters</u> shall only use the <u>Consumer Contact Data</u> as described in the use cases in Paragraph 5.
- 2.4 For the <u>PSR Data</u> and for the <u>Consumer Contact Data</u> that comprises personal data, each <u>Party</u> shall only access, update, share, use or otherwise process that data insofar



as the <u>Party</u> has a lawful basis for processing under the <u>Data Protection Legislation</u>. Such lawful basis for processing may include (but is not limited to): consent; legal obligation under <u>Law</u> or an <u>Energy Licence</u>; or legitimate interests weighed against the <u>Consumer</u>'s interests. To the extent that the personal data is special category data, the further conditions for processing will also apply.

2.5 Each <u>Party</u> shall comply with its obligations under the <u>Data Protection Legislation</u> concerning the <u>PSR Data</u> and the <u>Consumer Contact Data</u>, including those obligations concerning transparency. Clause 19 (Data Controller Obligations) of the <u>main body</u> of this <u>Code</u> applies.

3 Transfer of PSR Data

- 3.1 Where an <u>Energy Supplier</u> adds data to, removes data from or otherwise updates its Priority Services Register (including on a Change of Occupier):
 - (a) if the <u>Energy Supplier</u> is an <u>Electricity Supplier</u>, it shall send the <u>PSR Data</u> to all recipients of the <u>Market Message</u> D0225; and
 - (b) if the <u>Energy Supplier</u> is a <u>Gas Supplier</u>, it shall ensure that its <u>Shipper</u> sends the <u>PSR Record</u> to the <u>CDSP</u> (and the <u>CDSP</u> will then notify the <u>Gas Transporter</u>).
- 3.2 Where a <u>Switch</u> occurs and the <u>Consumer</u> is listed on the <u>Gaining Supplier</u>'s <u>Priority Services Register</u>:
 - (a) if the <u>Gaining Supplier</u> is an <u>Electricity Supplier</u>, upon completion of the <u>Switch</u>, it shall send the <u>PSR Data</u> to all recipients of <u>Market Message</u> D0225; and
 - (b) if the <u>Gaining Supplier</u> is a <u>Gas Supplier</u>, it shall ensure that its <u>Shipper</u> sends the PSR Record to the CDSP (and the CDSP will then notify the Gas Transporter).
- 3.3 For electricity <u>RMP</u>s, where a change of <u>Supplier Agent</u> occurs and the <u>Consumer</u> is listed on the <u>Electricity Supplier</u>'s <u>Priority Services Register</u>, the <u>Electricity Supplier</u> shall send <u>Market Message</u> D0225 to all relevant new <u>Supplier Agent</u>s.
- 3.4 For electricity <u>RMPs</u>, the <u>Distribution Network Operator</u> shall send <u>Market Message</u> D0225 to the <u>Registered Supplier</u> whenever the <u>Distribution Network Operator</u>'s <u>Priority Services Register</u> is changed as a result of information received from a source other than the <u>Registered Supplier</u>.
- 3.5 Each <u>Party</u> which sends updated <u>PSR Data</u> under this Paragraph 3 shall determine and record its basis for processing under the <u>Data Protection Legislation</u>. Where a <u>Party</u> is relying on <u>Consumer</u> consent for the processing of particular <u>PSR Data</u>, then the <u>Party</u> shall ensure that the relevant <u>Data Item</u> is populated to confirm that this is the basis for processing and that the data subject has provided their informed consent.
- 3.6 Where a <u>Party</u> is relying on <u>Consumer</u> consent for the processing of particular <u>PSR</u> <u>Data</u>, and where the data subject withdraws their consent, then the <u>Party</u> shall amend the <u>PSR Data</u> to remove the relevant personal data and send updates in accordance with this Paragraph 3.



4 Transfer of Consumer Contact Data (Electricity)

- 4.1 This Paragraph 4 only applies in respect of electricity RMPs.
- 4.2 The <u>Registered Supplier</u> shall provide updated <u>Consumer Contact Data</u> to the <u>Distribution Network Operator</u> on a first <u>Registration</u>, on a <u>Change of Occupier</u> or on otherwise becoming aware of updates to the <u>Consumer Contact Data</u>.
- 4.3 On a <u>Switch</u>, the <u>Gaining Supplier</u> shall provide updated <u>Consumer Contact Data</u> to the Distribution Network Operator.
- 4.4 Where the <u>Electricity Supplier</u> does not hold some or all the <u>Consumer Contact Data</u>, it shall transmit a blank / null record to overwrite any existing data.
- 4.5 Where an <u>Electricity Supplier</u> provides updated <u>Consumer Contact Data</u> under this Paragraph 4, it shall do so by sending <u>Market Message</u> D0302.

5 Transfer of Consumer Contact Data (Gas)

- 5.1 This Paragraph 5 only applies in respect of gas <u>RMP</u>s, and subject to Paragraph 1.10.
- 5.2 The <u>Registered Supplier</u> shall provide updated <u>Consumer Contact Data</u> in accordance with Paragraph 5.5 on a first <u>Registration</u>, on a <u>Change of Occupier</u> or on otherwise becoming aware of updates to the <u>Consumer Contact Data</u>.
- 5.3 On a <u>Switch</u>, the <u>Gaining Supplier</u> shall provide updated <u>Consumer Contact Data</u> in accordance with Paragraph 5.5.
- 5.4 Where the <u>Gas Supplier</u> does not hold some or all the <u>Consumer Contact Data</u>, it shall transmit a blank / null record to overwrite any existing data.
- 5.5 Where there is no longer a lawful basis under <u>Data Protection Legislation</u> for storing particular <u>Consumer Contact Data</u> in the <u>Secure Repository</u>, then the <u>Gas Supplier</u> shall ensure that the particular data is deleted by sending the relevant <u>Market Message</u>.
- 5.6 Where a <u>Gas Supplier</u> provides updated <u>Consumer Contact Data</u> under this Paragraph 5, it shall do so by ensuring that its <u>Shipper</u> sends the data to the <u>CDSP</u>, and the <u>CDSP</u> will then make the updated data available to <u>Gas Transporter</u>s as described in the remainder of this Paragraph 5.
- 5.7 The <u>CDSP</u> shall provide the <u>Secure Repository</u> for the storage of <u>Consumer Contact</u>
 <u>Data</u> provided by <u>Gas Suppliers</u>. The <u>CDSP</u> shall ensure that the <u>Secure Repository</u>
 provides for:
 - (a) a 'broadcast' function that enables a <u>Gas Transporter</u> to send text messages and/or emails to multiple <u>Consumers</u> without the contact data being visible to the <u>Gas</u>



Transporter; and

- (b) an 'extract' function that enables a <u>Gas Transporter</u> to extract <u>Consumer Contact</u> <u>Data</u> for the purposes of direct contact (in which case the contact data is visible to the <u>Gas Transporter</u>).
- 5.8 Each <u>Gas Transporter</u> shall only use <u>Consumer Contact Data</u> and the <u>Secure Repository</u> for the following purposes:
 - (a) Use Case 1 Unplanned Interruption Where the <u>Consumer</u> concerned is subject to an unplanned interruption to their gas supply and the <u>Gas Transporter</u> needs to contact the <u>Consumer</u> to provide information (including arranging to purge and relight the <u>Consumer</u>'s appliances) or needs to contact the <u>Consumer</u> to provide information including reinstatement of ground either in the <u>Consumer</u>'s premises or in public land and/or the highway that may affect the <u>Consumer</u>.
 - (b) Use Case 2 Planned Interruption Where the <u>Consumer</u> concerned is subject to a planned interruption to their gas supply, for example as part of a mains replacement project, and the <u>Gas Transporter</u> needs to contact the <u>Consumer</u> to provide information (including arranging to purge and relight the <u>Consumer</u>'s appliances) and/or needs to contact the <u>Consumer</u> to provide information including reinstatement of ground either in the <u>Consumer</u>'s premises or in public land and/or the highway that may affect the <u>Consumer</u>.
 - (c) Use Case 3 Gas Safety Regulations Cut-off Where the <u>Gas Transporter</u> is required to perform a service cut-off to satisfy the Gas Safety (Installation and Use) Regulations 1998 (as amended) and needs to contact the <u>Consumer</u> to arrange this.
 - (d) Use Case 4 Contact for Multiple Occupancy Building Where the <u>Consumer</u> occupies a building that has multiple occupants and the <u>Gas Transporter</u> needs to contact a number of <u>Consumers</u> for operational reasons, for example to replace the rising main.
 - (e) Use Case 5 Payment of Guaranteed Standard of Performance Payment Where the <u>Consumer</u> is due a <u>Guaranteed Standards of Performance</u> compensation payment and the <u>Gas Transporter</u> needs to contact them to arrange payment. <u>Guaranteed Standards of Performance</u> compensation payments being those payments which the <u>Gas Transporter</u> is obliged to pay under secondary legislation or its <u>Gas Transporter Licence</u> if the Transporter fails to meet the required quality standards. This use case can also be used where a <u>Gas Transporter</u> chooses to make a voluntary payment to a <u>Consumer</u>.
- 5.9 A <u>Gas Transporter</u> shall not allow any other person to use the 'broadcast' or 'extract' function in relation to the <u>Consumer Contact Data</u> held in the <u>Secure Repository</u> in relation to its network; except that a <u>Gas Transporter</u> may allow another <u>Gas Transporter</u> to do so in order to send a message which is of relevance to the <u>Consumers</u> of both <u>Gas Transporters</u>.
- 5.10 On a <u>Switch</u>, the relevant <u>Gas Transporter</u> shall ensure that the <u>Consumer Contact</u> Data provided by the previous <u>Gas Supplier</u> is deleted from the <u>Secure Repository</u>.
- 5.11 Each Gas Transporter using the Secure Repository:



- (a) shall be entitled to determine the content of the relevant message, and shall ensure that adequate contact information is provided to enable the <u>Consumer</u> to contact the <u>Gas Transporter</u>;
- (b) shall ensure that any <u>Consumer Contact Data</u> that it extracts from the <u>Secure Repository</u> is held only for as long as it is required and is promptly and securely deleted once no longer required;
- (c) shall specify and record a reason for processing when accessing or instructing the use of Consumer Contact Data, including why the broadcast or extract function was used; and
- (d) shall ensure that the <u>Consumer</u> is contacted using their preferred contact method (where one is recorded within the <u>Secure Repository</u>), but may also contact the <u>Consumer</u> using other contact methods where the circumstances reasonably require.
- 5.12 Where, in response to a communication received via the broadcast function, a Consumer informs the Gas Transporter that they wish to be permanently forgotten, then the Gas Transporter shall direct the Consumer to contact their Gas Supplier (but shall have no obligation to notify the Gas Supplier directly).
- 5.13 Where, in response to a communication received via the extract function, a <u>Consumer</u> wishes to be permanently forgotten, the <u>Gas Transporter</u> shall ensure that procedures exist to permanently delete the data extracted by the <u>Gas Transporter</u> in relation to that <u>Consumer</u>, and the <u>Gas Transporter</u> shall also advise the <u>Consumer</u> to contact their <u>Gas Supplier</u> to remove data held within the <u>Secure Repository</u>.
- 5.14 Where, in response to a communication received via the extract function, a Consumer wishes to have a 'temporary stop' on a particular broadcast communication, then the Gas Transporter shall ensure that the broadcast provider acts on this request and ceases any and all further communications related to the particular topic of the broadcast communication (but the Consumer will not be 'permanently forgotten').
- 5.15 The CDSP shall ensure that:
 - (a) there is a reporting function in the <u>Secure Repository</u> to enable reporting of usage by each <u>Gas Transporter</u> for each purpose defined in Paragraph 5.8, split by use of the broadcast and extract functions for defined date ranges; and
 - (b) where the <u>REC PAB</u> or <u>Code Manager</u> so request, the <u>CDSP</u> provides a report detailing the number of requests and usage reasons for a defined period in relation to requests by <u>Gas Transporters</u> to use <u>Consumer Contact Data</u> held in the <u>Secure Repository</u>.
