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February 2024 REC Release

R0093 - Uplift to CSS Maximum Demand Volumes During MHHS Migration Period - Appeal

On 08 February 2024, an Appeal was raised against the REC Technical Expert Panel's vote to approve R0093 - Uplift to CSS Maximum Demand Volumes during MHHS Migration Period. The Code Manager has submitted an appeal to the Authority on 15 February 2024.

As a result, R0093 will not be implemented on 23 February 2024. The February 2024 Release Plan will be updated accordingly.

MHHS Code Drafting 'Mop Up 2': Final Review Consultation

MHHS programme participants will have a final opportunity to review and provide feedback on the MHHS code drafting captured in the Code Artefacts in the upcoming Mop Up 2 consultation. The Programme will publish the Mop Up 2 Code Artefacts for participant review on 19 February 2024 and comments will be due by 17:00 on 11 March 2024. All participants are requested to ensure resource is allocated to complete this review.

MHHS Supply, Distribution & Transmission Licence Review Consultation

The MHHS Programme has published the **MHHS Supply, Distribution & Transmission Licence Review** document for consultation. Comments are due by **17:00** on **13 March 2024**.

There is a BSC requirement (<u>BSC Section C 12.5.2(a)</u>) for the MHHS Senior Responsible Owner (SRO) to "identify and inform the Authority of, any and all further modifications to energy licences which

are required for MHHS implementation". The Programme has reviewed all Standard Licence Conditions in the Supply, Distribution and Transmission Licences, which are available on the <u>Licences</u> and <u>Licence Conditions</u> page on the Ofgem website.

As a result, we conclude that **no licence changes** are required for **MHHS** implementation. However, the review identified a few areas that Ofgem may want to consider as to whether changes are required as a consequence of MHHS (e.g. reference to Profile Classes). Participants are requested to review the document and provide comments (if needed).

MHHS Pre-Qualification Submission

All Non-SIT Suppliers, Supplier Agents and MEMs, and new entrant DNOs - referred to as a Licensed Distribution System Operator (LDSO) in the MHHS Programme - are required to provide a Pre-Qualification Submission (PQS) for MHHS Qualification.

The submission will include all the information that Code Bodies need to make an informed judgement on a Party's readiness and suitability to be allocated to a particular Qualification Wave. The information provided will also help Code Bodies to understand the resource and testing capacity required to support each Qualification Wave. For further information on the Qualification Waves, Parties should consult the Qualification Approach and Plan.

Please note that:

- SIT participants are not expected to submit the PQS for the roles and Market Participant IDs (MPIDs) they are participating with in SIT. The proposed process for Qualification Assessment Document (QAD) submission for SIT Participants is set out in the <u>Qualification Approach and Plan</u>.
- Existing DNOs participating in Non-SIT LDSO Qualification are not expected to submit the PQS.

All electricity REC Parties are required to become MHHS Qualified to operate the new MHHS arrangements. Some REC Parties have volunteered to support MHHS Programme testing through SIT. Others (referred to as Non-SIT Parties) will need to undertake Qualification Testing directly with Code Bodies.

The PQS window opened on **05 February 2024** and final submissions must be provided **by 17:00 on 26 April 2024**. The Code Bodies are hosting a **Pre-Qualification Submission webinar on 07 March 2024**.

Balance and Settlement Code (BSC) - Issue 101 Consultation

The REC Code Manager would like to highlight the upcoming BSC Issue 101 Consultation to all REC Participants.

The BSC are seeking views from potential Data Integration Platform (DIP) Users and other interested parties on the proposed arrangements and drafting for the enduring governance, funding and operation of the DIP. The arrangements, legal text and subsidiary documents have been developed by Elexon as part of Issue 101 'Ongoing Governance, Funding and Operation of the Market-wide Half Hourly Settlement (MHHS) DIP by BSCCo'.

The DIP is a vital technical component of the transition to MHHS that will be used to share data including Half-Hourly consumption data from consumers' smart meters. Ofgem have tasked Elexon with proposing the future governance arrangements for the DIP; Issue 101 was raised to gather industry input to help develop the arrangements. This consultation on the proposed arrangements and drafting for the DIP is to allow for industry engagement prior to the drafting being implemented as part of an Authority-led Significant Code Review Modification.

- Addition of the Energised No Meter report and update of No Meter MTC reports to being for information only.
