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February 2024 REC Release

The Code elements of the February 2024 (3.8.0) REC Release have been implemented today, 23 February 2023. This Release introduces three changes:

- R0071 DCC Access to EES & GES
- R0103 Central provision of DCC Technical Contacts for Requesting Test Certificates
- R0156 Updates to the CSS Message Business Data Validation Rules and Physical Interface
 Design Specification

R0145 – Decision to Reject Implementation

At the Metering Expert Panel meeting on 14 February 2024, the Panel voted to reject the Code Manager's recommendation to approve R0145 - Service Termination Issue Reporting (Change to Category 2 Document).

Under REC Schedule 5 – Change Management, when a Responsible Committee rejects the recommendation of the Code Manager with respect to a Self-Governance Change Proposal, the Change Proposal is automatically referred to Ofgem (as the Authority) for its determination, unless the Code Manager changes its recommendation based on the reasons provided by the relevant subcommittee.

Following consideration of the decision made by the Metering Expert Panel and the reasons for its rejection, the Code Manager has decided to amend its recommendation, and is now recommending the rejection of R0145. The Code Manager maintains that the business case for R0145 was made, and the solution does address the identified problem statement, and this was reflected in the comments of a majority of group members as the R0145 was progressed and during the vote. However, it is clear that some RECMEP members are supportive of a change to the governance of this document that would remove it from the REC completely. Although this was outside of the scope of the original change, it was a consistent theme throughout the development of R0145.

Consequently, R0145 has been rejected for implementation and the decision will not be referred to Ofgem.

R0147 Prepayment Levelisation – Notice of Implementation

On 23 February 2024, the Authority issued its decision to the Code Manager, to approve R0147 - Prepayment Levelisation for implementation on 28 March 2024. The decision document can be found on the REC Portal here.

This Change Proposal will be included in the 28 March 2024 Release Plan, to reflect the approval, and the completion of the update will be confirmed via the REC Change Bulletin.

The Authority's decision has been published at the same time as the decision on the related Licence Modifications. The Licence Modifications and new arrangements for Payment Method Levelisation (PML) Reconciliation under the REC, will come into effect on **01 April 2024**.

MHHS Code Drafting 'Mop Up 2': Final Review Consultation

The MHHS Programme Code Workstream issued the Topic Mop Up 2 Code Artefacts for consultation on 19 February 2024. Metering is the REC area most impacted by the MHHS Design, and this is reflected in the Code Drafting. The Code Topic Mop Up 2 consultation is the final opportunity for industry to feed into the Code Drafting before it is baselined and submitted for approval by the Programme and Ofgem thereafter.

Qualification Assessment Document (QAD)

The QAD sets out the information and evidence that market participants are required to provide to the REC and Balancing Settlement Code (BSC) Code Bodies so that they can be MHHS Qualified to operate under the new arrangements. The QAD has been developed through discussions with the MHHS Qualification Working Group (QWG) and has been provided to industry for consultation. The QAD consultation window will close at 17:00 on **01 March 2024**. To access the QAD and for details on

MHHS Pre-Qualification Submission (PQS)

All Non-SIT Suppliers, Supplier Agents and MEMs, and new entrant DNOs - referred to as a Licensed Distribution System Operator (LDSO) in the MHHS Programme - are required to provide a Pre-Qualification Submission (PQS) for MHHS Qualification.

The submission will include all the information that Code Bodies need to make an informed judgement on a Party's readiness and suitability to be allocated to a particular Qualification Wave. The information provided will also help Code Bodies to understand the resource and testing capacity required to support each Qualification Wave. For further information on the Qualification Waves, Parties should consult the Qualification Approach and Plan.

Please note that:

- SIT participants are not expected to submit the PQS for the roles and Market Participant IDs (MPIDs) they are participating with in SIT. The proposed process for QAD submission for SIT Participants is set out in the <u>Qualification Approach and Plan</u>.
- Existing DNOs participating in Non-SIT LDSO Qualification are not expected to submit the PQS.

All electricity REC Parties are required to become MHHS Qualified to operate the new MHHS arrangements. Some REC Parties have volunteered to support MHHS Programme testing through SIT. Others (referred to as Non-SIT Parties) will need to undertake Qualification Testing directly with Code Bodies.

The PQS window opened on **05 February 2024** and final submissions must be provided by 17:00 on **26 April 2024**. The Code Bodies are hosting a **Pre-Qualification Submission webinar** on **07 March 2024**.
