Any party that receives a message directly from CSS and needs to validate its authenticity will need a copy of the latest CSS JWS (Public) Production signing certificate. The CSS JWS (Public) Production Certificate will expire on 03 March 2024. The JWS Certificate is issued to digitally sign each message and validates that the message sender is authenticated and the message integrity. Each CSS User that receives messages from CSS will need to install the updated certificate to ensure messages can still be authenticated. This Portal page provides further details.

MHHS Qualification Approach and Plan (QA&P) Consultation

On 31 January 2024, the MHHS QA&P, produced by the Retail Energy Code (REC) and Balancing and Settlement Code (BSC), was published for a 10-working day consultation. All REC Parties who are intending to operate in the new MHHS arrangements, will need to go through MHHS Qualification and are encouraged to provide feedback on this document.

The QA&P sets out the purpose of MHHS Qualification during the MHHS Programme, and provides the high-level plan and requirements, in relation to the BSC and REC. The QA&P is accompanied by two Annexes which are also published for consultation:

- Annex 1: Non-Systems Integration Testing (SIT) Licensed Distribution System Operator (LDSO) MHHS Qualification Testing Approach & Plan. This annex sets out the approach for Non-SIT LDSO Qualification Testing during the MHHS Programme and provides the high-level plan and requirements for Non-SIT LDSO participants to complete Qualification Testing as part of their overall MHHS Qualification. P1 Major Switching Incident Review Webinar

MEMs DNOs Suppliers On 06 July 2023, a <u>Major Switching Incident occurred</u> within the Central Switching Service (CSS), which prevented successful energy supply switches and new registrations for gas and electricity. Whilst now resolved, the incident significantly impacted multiple industry parties and their end consumers.

After the July 2023 incident, RECCo conducted a thorough review with the REC Code Manager to understand what happened and recommend measures to prevent, detect and more effectively manage future incidents. RECCo have now published their full review report and executive summary <u>here</u>.

Following this publication, RECCo are hosting a webinar on **12 February 2024** (13:00 – 14:00). This session aims to provide a detailed overview of the incident, the lessons learned, and the strategic measures to prevent, detect, and manage similar incidents in line with their commitments as the review is formally closed. <u>Register now</u>.
