Qualification Approach & Plan (QA&P) Annex 2 Consultation

The Qualification Approach and Plan (QA&P) Annex 2: Non-SIT Supplier & Agent MHHS Qualification Testing Approach has been published for consultation. The document sets out the specific MHHS Qualification Testing requirements, scope, testing framework, objectives, and approach for Non-SIT Suppliers and Agents. This document applies to Non-SIT Suppliers and Agents including new entrant Supplier and Agents who are looking to enter the market before M14.

Non-SIT Supplier & Agent Qualification Testing Test Scenarios Consultation

The initial list of Batch 1 Qualification Test Scenarios and Cases for Non-SIT Supplier and Agent Qualification Testing has been published for consultation. Batch 1 contains the core list of Functional Test Scenarios in scope. Analysis is still ongoing to identify any gaps and the output of this analysis plus consultation feedback will inform Batch 2.

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Pre-Qualification Submission

All Non-SIT Suppliers, Agents, and New Entrant DNOs (referred to as LDSOs in the MHHS Programme) Programme Participants are required to provide a Pre-Qualification Submission (PQS) for MHHS Qualification. The PQS window opened on 05 February 2024 and final submissions are due by 17:00 on **26 April 2024**.

The submission includes all the information that Code Bodies need to make an informed judgement on a party's readiness and suitability to be allocated to a particular Qualification Wave.

Participants are expected to submit their Pre-Integration Testing (PIT) Approach and Plan as supporting evidence for their PQS submission.

Please note that SIT participants are not expected to submit the PQS for the roles and Market Participant IDs (MPIDs) they are participating with in SIT. The proposed process for the Qualification Assessment Document (QAD) submission for SIT Participants is set out in the [Qualification Approach and Plan](#).

Existing LDSOs participating in Non-SIT LDSO Qualification are not expected to submit the PQS.

The Code Bodies are hosting drop-in sessions for participants who require further support in completing their PQS. The sessions are open to all participants completing the PQS and they will be recorded and published on the Collaboration Base. They will take place on:

- **04 April 2024** (11:00 - 12:00)
- **09 April 2024:** there will be a session at the end of the Qualification Working Group
- **17 April 2024** (14:00 - 15:00)

REC Assessment Criteria v2.0

The REC Assessment Criteria for MHHS Qualification V2.0 has been uploaded following approval at the Performance Assurance Board meeting on 26 March 2024. To access this document, click [here](#).

For each MHHS requirement, the REC Assessment Criteria for MHHS Qualification sets out whether a REC Party will need to provide PIT evidence, undertake Qualification Testing or provide a response to a Qualification Assessment Document (QAD) question.

This second iteration of the REC Assessment Criteria has been updated to cover MHHS Non-Functional and Migration requirements, aligned with the latest version of the Qualification Approach and Plan and incorporates general housekeeping changes.

Qualification Approach and Plan v2.0 and Qualification Assessment Document v1.0

On 26 March 2024, the Performance Assurance Board approved updates to the Qualification Approach and Plan (QA&P) and the Qualification Assessment Document (QAD). These documents have been jointly developed with Elexon and therefore have been submitted for BSC PAB approval on 28 March 2024.
