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June 2024 REC Release

The Code elements of the June 2024 (3.11.0) REC Release have been implemented today, 28 June 2024. This Release introduces six changes:

- R0043 Commissioning of Works by the Crowded Meter Room Coordinator (CMRC) to Resolve Issues in Crowded Meter Rooms
- R0064 Creating a Meter Operator Agent and MOCoP Installer
- R0070- Provision of Enduring Test Environments
- R0142 Amendment to Multiplication Factor Enumerations to Support Hydrogen Trials
- R0158 Amendment to the 'Supplier Registration Report (MAP)' Report Methodology
- R0160 Electricity Supply to Hydrogen Electrolysers

All the updated REC Products can be located on the REC Portal. Updates to EMAR and Digital Navigator will be completed by the end of the day.

The REC Baseline Statement has been updated with the new product version numbers.

R0098 - Optional Fuzzy Searching in EES

R0098 was raised to allow optional fuzzy searching within the Electricity Enquiry Service (EES). This change was scheduled for release on **28 June 2024**. During performance testing of the changes applied to the EES API to accommodate the R0098 requirements, a degradation of response time was identified, and subsequently, the implementation of this Change will be delayed. Once a new release date has been agreed, it will be communicated via email and the REC Portal.

All registered SDEP Master Administrative Users (MAU) have been contacted directly, and provided a template to complete if they wish to participate in this exercise.

REC Code Roadmap Refresh V1.3

A refreshed version of the REC Code Roadmap (V1.3) has now been <u>published on the REC Digital Navigator</u>. The Code Roadmap presents the priority work items that the Code Manager is delivering now and in the near future that could result in changes to the REC. Points of note from V1.3 include:

- New Change Proposal R0182 raised and has been associated with the Prepayment theme
- Nine Consultations/Impact Assessments will be open through July and August. Contact your OAM or change.management@recmanager.co.uk with any queries.
- Seven Change Proposals implemented in the 28 June 2024 Release span six Roadmap themes. Refer to the <u>Portal</u> to find out more. The next Release is 23 August 2024 with up to seven Change Proposals to be implemented.
- Future CPs are expected on the Smart Meter Installation Survey (SMIS), Switching Incentives (CRS provider), MHHS REC legal text, MPAN/UPRN linking, prepayment unallocated process, Unbilled energy and Address Management. Look out for further information if you have an interest in these topics.

We welcome your feedback on the Roadmap, including on any priorities you consider to be insufficiently represented in the change pipeline, or where you would like to see other information included on the roadmap.

The Code Roadmap is published in the Digital Navigator and refreshed approximately fortnightly.

Consistency Check Consultation: The Code Artefacts Consistency Check is the final MHHS Programme industry consultation for the Code Artefacts. This consistency check is to ensure that the Code Artefacts align with the latest Design Artefacts, and to do a final check via a cross-code review, legal review, traceability matrix, format, and terminology review and to ensure that the series align with each other. The full set of REC artefacts that have been impacted by MHHS code drafting are included in this consultation. The Code Artefacts are published on the MHHS Website. Qualification Materials Published

Qualification Testing (QT) Wave Allocation Confirmation: Code Bodies are emailing the QT Wave Allocation Confirmation this week to the key contact listed within the Pre-Qualification Submission. If Parties were expecting this but have not received it by close of business on 28 June 2024, they can reach out to the Code Bodies via MHHSQualification@elexon.co.uk.

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Smart Market Segment requirements exemption request for MHHS Qualification: REC Performance Assurance Board (PAB) has approved the principles for exemptions from Smart Market Segment requirements for MHHS Qualification for Suppliers who meet the eligibility criteria and can demonstrate appropriate controls to operate without breaching their exemption conditions.

Please note that this provision is subject to approval by the BSC PAB and the implementation of the BSC Modification to allow application. The paper presented at PAB can be found here. The REC Code Manager will work with BSCCo to provide further updates on this via the Qualification Working Group within MHHS governance.

REC Assessment Criteria for MHHS Qualification: REC PAB approved the REC Assessment Criteria V3.0 to include coverage of Operational requirements. The updated documents can be accessed via the REC Portal as a <u>PDF</u> or <u>Excel</u> Spreadsheet.

Assessing Party Readiness for MHHS Cutover reminder: REC Party SIT participants should respond to the RFI on their plans for assessment to identify any risks to delivery by **08 July 2024**. The relevant Parties will have received this request via email.

GES Upgrade - Temporary Roll-Back

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GES Users

On 21 June 2024, the GES Service Provider announced the transition of the Gas Enquiry Service (GES) to a new technology platform. This upgrade aims to enhance resilience and provide a more efficient, cost-effective solution for REC Parties.

After the switch on 22 June 2024, post-implementation testing revealed a few issues, leading to a small number of customer tickets. As a precaution, the GES Service Provider has partially rolled back GES to the old platform while the issues are thoroughly investigated. Consequently, the GES Portal and the Supply Point Switching (SPS) API are now operating on the legacy platform, whereas the Supply Point Enquiry (SPE) and Meter Point Enquiry (MPE) API services continue to run on the new platform.

<u>Next steps</u>: Once the issues have been fully investigated and fixes have been tested, the GES Service Provider will transition the GES Online Portal and the Supply Point Switching API (SPS) back to the new platform. This will be confirmed through further communications. If you encounter any functionality issues, <u>please contact the GES Service Provider by raising a ticket</u>. We apologise for any inconvenience caused during this transition.
